Dr. Robin Landwehr joined CHAD as the behavioral health and substance abuse program manager in January 2020. Robin is a licensed professional clinical counselor (LPCC), and her role is to support behavioral health staff across the CHAD network. She has particular expertise in integrating behavioral health with primary care and she will be responsible for promoting, supporting, and facilitating the integration of behavioral health and substance use disorder (SUD) services in CHCs in the Dakotas. She will also promote health center work through collaboration with state and national partners.

Formerly, Robin served as the behavioral health director at Spectra Health in North Dakota. During her career in behavioral health integration, Robin provided program development, behavioral health consultation, and staff supervision and assisted in establishing a Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) program at an FQHC. Robin's experience as a clinical counselor includes assisting individuals struggling with trauma, depression, anxiety, health behaviors, substance abuse, and other issues. She is also a former member of the disaster mental health team for the American Red Cross – Dakotas Region.

Robin is a certified instructor in the Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR), and Counseling on Access to Lethal Means (CALM) suicide prevention programs. She holds a Master of Science degree in mental health counseling from Capella University and a Doctor of Behavioral Health (DBH) degree from Arizona State University.
